

Matthew 25:35,37,40 says "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat and something to drink..., then the righteous will answer him, Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink?, the King will reply, I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me."

First Pres Hanford is blessed to have a loving & caring congregation who supports our food pantry. Currently, our food donations are given to the Kings Gospel Mission (KGM) a local Christian organization that shares the gospel with everyone involved.

As we encounter inflation at the grocery store & elsewhere, we have all noticed the squeeze in finances. We have also noted that giving to the food pantry at church has really declined. Kings Gospel Mission & other charities are encountering a decline in donations as we all face difficult times.

The Deacons would like to Challenge our Congregation: Consider giving to the least of these by bringing 1 can of food or boxed food (nonperishable) to church each month to help others in need. Wouldn't it be exciting to see a pyramid of 60 cans of food or more that can then be delivered to those who have so little each month.

I've always been inspired by Mother Teresa's quote "If you can't feed a hundred people, then feed just one." Consider if you have children at home getting them involved to choose the item to bring each month. This is a great teaching moment about God calling us to generosity and helping those in need.

God loves us, gives to us and inspires us to live with generosity and goodness. Thank you for being a blessing to others and helping to relieve their challenges.

Moving into February, the Finance/Stewardship Committee would like to give you an update. First Presbyterian Church ended 2022 with a surplus supporting the ministries financially that we know and love. The tithes and offerings received covered those ministries and current staff with a nice sum left over at the end of the year due to the generosity of several gifts. We continue planning to pay moving expenses at such time as we have a new pastor coming and have set aside a good amount for that. The balance of our surplus from 2022 was designated to go towards the Economic Uncertainty Fund, with Session approval, for any other expenses that might arise with a new pastor.

We persevere and remain steadfast in our hope that the expenses noted in our 2023 general fund budget of \$304,454.53, — Staff (including our new pastor), Missions, and Ministry Programs — WILL BE covered through our routinely given tithes & offerings. This "could" allow FPC to use the funds that were cautiously set aside, during 2020, 2021, & 2022, to be used in 2023 for other areas of ministry and needs of our church! The Finance Committee commends all our committees and staff for diligently watching costs as they run our church and ministries. God has been incredibly faithful to lead us and move the hearts of members of our congregation who have given this past year!

First Presbyterian Church has a 2023 Faith Commitment goal of \$285,000. As of December 18,2022, our pledge total is \$113,060 or 39.67% of our goal. We have not received any new pledges since December 18th. It is not too late to turn in your Faith Commitment form. If God is nudging you to take this step for the first time or to consider making a sacrifice to pledge or increase your pledge, we hope you will submit and obey His command.

For those of you who choose not to pledge but **DO** give regularly, we thank you! We saw an increase in such offering last year. We thank everyone, pledgers and non-pledgers, who gives as they feel God is leading them! God is faithful and continues to guide us on the mission He has planned for us.
