## March 2023



Last month we focused on the big holiday of February, Valentine's Day. So, what do you do with March? Saint Patrick's Day? Another, "Saint?" Isn't this one mostly about green beer and leprechauns, and something about snakes and shamrock shakes? There is nothing really redeeming in this story, is there? Well, let's toss it around for few minutes and see what we come up with.

Let's take a look at the, "big strokes" of the story related to Saint Patrick. Detailed and exact historical records are really hard to verify and since most of the materials written are almost two hundred years after his death date of March 17, 461(or 462) lots of embellishment seems to have occurred. The big points prevail: While about 16 years of age in Roman influenced England he is kidnapped (?) (self exiled?) to Ireland and seems to be a slave of some sort. Escaping (fleeing) he tries to get back home. After a long journey, succeeds. Mid-twenties he is studying in the Christian faith. He feels a "call" to go back to Ireland and bring the Gospel. Off he goes to the people that enslaved him, bringing the Good News of Jesus Christ. That's admirable at the least.

One of his favorite illustrations is the Shamrock. Three leaves growing as one. The trinity in perfect unity. One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. That is a nice illustration. Perhaps we can share that this month with someone who doesn't know the significance. A good way to witness gently.


Or, the other great tradition most people seem to know about – driving the snake(s) out of Ireland. Please note, this is my own take on the story that may or may not hold water, but sounds more likely coming from a guy like Saint Patrick than much of what I hear or read. Well before Saint Patrick, there were very few snakes in Ireland. What about that snake from the Bible? Did Saint Patrick drown that snake in the waters of Baptism time and time again? Was the ridding of the snake(s) of the evil one and bringing the presence of Christ? I'm thinking that legend is a better story and more likely in view of a young man who baptized thousands and thousands.

Could we use a little bit of Saint Patrick in our lives this month? Reach out to those who have enslaved us. Tell the Good News with a parable about that shamrock shake that has become so popular. Talk about that snake that likes to tempt us to evil and help drive that snake into the waters of baptism to be gone forever – never to be seen again.

Maybe Saint Patrick (in legend, lore and reality) has something even more to give us than Saint Valentine who sits in the rear-view mirror of March 2023. Have a happy Saint Patrick's Day.

# FPC Mission Opportunity to Cameroon, Africa!!!

# Tentative Dates – Dec 1<sup>st</sup> to Dec 10<sup>th</sup> 2023 (plus 4 days travel)

We have a wonderful chance to travel to Cameroon, Africa, with Paul Ela NSA, Missions Team co-chair and FPC Elder. Paul is from Cameroon. He has served as an Elder in the Efulan Presbyterian Church and will be leading us on this journey to visit this church along with the Yaounde Presbyterian Missions, Ebolowa Presbyterian Missions, and Kribi Erwin Good Presbyterian Missions in Cameroon. This will give us a chance to build a Covenant church relationship with the Efulan Presbyterian Church congregation as well as share faith, cultures, and experiences as missionaries. The itinerary also includes all food arrangements (provided by a private chef), accommodations, and ground transportation.

Temperatures during our journey through the south/central part of Cameroon during the first part of December is said to be hot and humid (lows in the 60's, highs in the 80's).

Cost is **estimated** at \$4,000, which covers flight, food, housing, ground transportation and Visa fees. Immunizations needed for travel & Covid restrictions will be at own expense. Deposit on this opportunity is \$400.


### The Shower Bus
