For me, each year January is, without a doubt, the darkest, coldest, dampest month of the year in the Central Valley. I get along with the heat of summer better than I get along with the dark, the mill cold, and the dampness. It is a good time to be in Hawaii or Palm Springs. Arizona has its best month of the year in January. How is one supposed to keep faith when it is so cold, and dark, and damp?

I know, I'll watch one of my favorite movies, "Hook." What does that do for me, you say? It is in that movie where Smee declares he has had an, "apostrophe." Of course, Captain Hook corrects him declaring, "You mean an epiphany." Yes an epiphany. That's what I have in January. Every January 6th the Epiphany of our Lord comes forth. So, now I have an Epiphany to get me through the dark and cold and dampest month. (I think it's the dampness that really gets me – my toes never get warm.)

Epiphany is the conclusion after the 12 days of Christmas. Traditionally on Epiphany the Wise Men arrive to offer their gifts to the God incarnate, the Christ child. Epiphany is the true day of gift giving in many of the middle-eastern cultures and often the greatest or most valued gift is opened on that day. It warms my heart just to think of the joy and the prophecy of Epiphany.

Three wise men that have traveled some distance to see the Christ child. The suspicion is these were priests from the Zoroastrian religion; a religion based on the stars and constellations. This is our first signal that Christ is for the whole world, not just a small sect in the Middle East. These well-educated and highly thought of sojourners tell us that Christ, the humble child of average means, may reach through culture and class to redeem the world for God's sake. What a gift they gave to the child, but also to us.

Maybe a new tradition could be started in your household this Epiphany. You could always start by watching the movie, "Hook," and then progress to giving that last special gift of Christmas to someone you loved. Or maybe it is more your style to go and do something unexpected, the aha, what a surprise, kind of activity. Go help at the mission, or baby-sit some children so dad and mom can have the afternoon together and have their own epiphany. What if you just spent time reading scripture until you discovered something you had not discovered before? An epiphany straight from the word of God!

Smee had an epiphany, a sudden new and great thought. We have the Epiphany; when the world is surprised and the light goes on that this child, Christ, is God incarnate – God with us, and it will change the whole world. My prayer for you this new year is to have an epiphany on Epiphany. May Christ richly bless you in your journey through the year 2021.


Thank you for your generosity and gifts of love! The Deacon's program is designed to help those who could use some extra attention at Christmastime.

FPC Missionaries . . . 2022 Expanding Our Horizons

"He said to them, Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation" Mark 16:15

As the New Year begins, new horizons and opportunities also emerge and there is much to look forward to in 2022 for our missionaries who are serving the Lord through their mission work sharing and spreading the Gospel to the unreached peoples of the world.

As we continue to partner with our 2021 Missionaries, your Mission Ministry Team is excited to be expanding our mission outreach this 2022 by partnering with and helping two new EPC World Outreach Missionary couples:

Josh and Katya both have experience living as "Mission Kids" (MKs) and they know first-hand that as MKs are transplanted, it is typical for them to experience issues with identity, belonging, loss, and grief. Statistically, MKs are more vulnerable and at high risk for experiencing trauma, mental illness, and suicide. Being there for kids first-thing on field, however, makes space for critical, timely debriefing of difficult and traumatic experiences, spiritual formation, and empowering parents to understand and help their children as challenges arise. Josh and Katya see MK care as a clear responsibility of the Body of Christ, and believe that on-field help can prevent many years of ensuing heartache and confusion. Their desire is for MKs to thrive in faith and health and for workers' families to flourish and serve sustainably. Josh and Katya know their calling is to minister to those reaching the least reached so that they do not become lost themselves.

Rupesh and Susanna are two of EPC World Outreach's most resilient global workers. When US Immigration Services told them they had to leave the country, when Covid restrictions shut down their discipleship school, when Covid put Rupesh in the ICU, their response was the same – "Thank you, Lord. Your plans are better than ours. Show us how to glorify you in this." That attitude has helped them pivot, move ahead, and accomplish more in less time and with fewer resources than most showing they truly have a heart for missions. Currently serving in South Asia, they lead pastor trainings to many believers and have founded a youth church providing a safe place for un-churched youth and new believers to come and worship the Lord together without persecution of their faith.

Let us welcome the New Year with thanksgiving and praise to the Lord for bringing us through 2021 and giving us a fresh start in 2022. Please remember to pray for all missionaries whether overseas or on our own home field, for their safety, needed resources in their mission ministry, and that doors will be opened for them to continue to share the Word of God!

Happy New Year to all who love the First Presbyterian Church of Hanford! Your Finance/Stewardship Team would like to update you on a couple things.

At the December Session meeting, we presented the 2022 budget of \$317,962.29 for their approval. This budget is filled with hope for our congregation as our Pastor Search Committee continues to follow God's lead in seeking our new pastor! It also includes the hope to be able to reinstate the Director of Music position and our Childcare Coordinator at some point in the coming year!


These may sound like lofty goals but God has continued to bless us and provide for us with all we have gone through. If you have not submitted your 2022 faith commitment, please consider doing so now! As of December 19th, faith commitments received totaled \$114,516 putting us at 40.18% of our goal. Our congregation is amazing and we look forward to meeting our faith commitment goal of \$285,000 by the end of this month!

In the last decade cyber threats are becoming more common, causing loss of time personal or sensitive data. Our church is covered for things such as this through our Church Mutual Insurance plan. When we met with our agent to review our coverage for the upcoming year, he pointed this out and let us know individuals can also purchase this on their own through Beazley Breach Services! 


