In 2016 Hannah Peterson was involved in a serious car accident just one month before her wedding in Ontario. She broke her pelvis in three places, punctured a kidney, broke some ribs, and suffered a concussion and partial hearing loss during the July 18 collision.

Despite being confined to a wheelchair, Hannah was determined not to let the accident affect her big day on August 25. So when it came time to walk down the aisle, Hannah's father wheeled her part of the way down, and then her fiancé, Stuart, tenderly carried her in his arms the rest of the way.

Hannah, 23, who along with her now-husband is originally from Northern Ireland, said that despite her predicament, the only emotion she allowed herself to feel on her wedding day was joy. "Obviously, being in the wheelchair and not able to walk was very upsetting for me on my wedding day," she told reporters.

Because of her injuries, Hannah sat during most of the ceremony, but wanted to stand for one very important part. "I was determined to stand for my vows," she said. "It was hard on me to stand for that long even with Stuart holding me up, but it doesn't seem obvious in the pictures and video the pain I was in."

Hannah continued to heal in the months subsequent to the wedding day. She is now able to walk around the house using a cane. She added: "Stuart has never left my side during all of this ... He was strong for both of us. He always made me see how blessed I was."

I believe this is a powerful word picture for us. We, too, were wounded by sin and helpless, but God came to our aid and carried us into a loving relationship with Himself. During this month that typically focuses upon love – Valentine's Day – let us remember the remarkable, inexpressible, unfathomable, unconditional love that God expresses to us in his Son, Jesus. Romans 8:38 reminds us, "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

4 NEW Ways to Pray for the Compassion International Child You Sponsor!

For children living in poverty, there is often no safety net. Hunger, disease and disaster are constantly pressing in. Here are four creative and new prayers for the child you sponsor to help you deepen your talks with God!

1. Give Yourself a Reminder

Put a jingle bell in your car that rings when you make a turn (or driving in particularly crazy traffic). And with each ring, lift up a quick prayer for your child you sponsor. That happy little sound will remind you to pray for his or her happiness. Ask God to give him or her joy at that moment, and that will bring a smile to your face too. Even if the traffic is crazy!

2. Take a Prayer Walk

The next time you decide to go out for a walk, turn it into a prayer walk, both for the child you sponsor, as well as for other children in poverty. When you pass a house with puffs of smoke coming out of the chimney, pray for your child's home and safety. If you walk by children playing in the yard, pray for your child's friendships. When you walk by a school, pray for his or her education. The possibilities are only limited by the length of your walk!

3. Pray about the News

When you hear a news report about something happening in another country, will you lift up a prayer for the people living there? Pray for those suffering during natural disasters. Pray for children who are surrounded by war and violence. Your own local news can remind you to pray too – a weather report is a good time to pray that the children Compassion serves will have warm, dry homes to protect them from the elements.

4. Pray Over Your Letters

The next time you write a letter to your sponsored child, will you say a prayer before you seal the envelope, or click send? Pray that your words will be received at the exact right time. That your letter will be placed in your child's hands when he or she needs to hear your words the most. Your letters are such a powerful instrument of hope – tuck a little prayer into your next note.

Prayer is Powerful!!!! Please remember to pray daily for your sponsored child, others in poverty, and also for all our families and missionaries who are giving of themselves working to spread the Word of God. Prayer is Powerful!!!

Above all, the giving of this congregation is allowing us to invest in the spiritual and eternal welfare of people in Hanford and all over the world through our various ministries and mission support.

Our preliminary 2019 budget proposal is \$316,884, which is the anticipated expenses, ministries, and dreams for additions to support those objectives. The difference between our budgeted expenses and the \$285,000 pledge goal is \$31,884. This represents additional contributions which we receive from those who do not pledge & those who give additionally throughout the year. We continue to pray and dream, thus we hope to maintain and even expand our staffing and hire a part time children's director, expand our youth director & music director's hours; we want to continue improvements to our church campus, as well as continue our ministries, outreach & missions.

These dreams could become reality with additional giving over and above our pledge goal of \$285,000. Our congregation has been blessed with a wonderful Pastor and Staff, all of whom are helping our church move in a biblical direction. We have great programs which include music ministries, youth & children ministries, small groups of all ages, Body Life and more. As God blesses our church, we in turn bless others with our Outreach to the community and with our Mission Giving to those in need. "Laundry Love" and "Safe Families for Children" are examples of these. All of these areas require your tithes and offerings to the general ministries operating budget in order to happen. It is up to each of you in our congregation to determine the extent to which you would have our church grow. We are all Christ's disciples and we need your help as we reach out to those who are lost and bring them into our family.

It's not too late to turn in your pledge/commitment form! 
