Who Are We?

At the January planning meeting with the Session, it became evident that a large number of this congregation is unaware of the structure, duties, and responsibilities for boards and organizations at First Presbyterian Church of Hanford. I am going to try and address this lack of knowledge so that all may become aware of Who We Are.



We are a church within the <u>E</u>vangelical <u>P</u>resbyterian <u>C</u>hurch. Our, "Presbytery" within that denomination is POPS (<u>P</u>resbytery <u>O</u>f the <u>P</u>acific <u>S</u>outhwest). That means we are tied together from the San Diego Boarder, to the Northern Boarder of California (almost), all of Nevada and a very thin slice on the Western Edge of Arizona and, of course, Hawaii, with thirty other churches that make up POPS. Along with 13 other Presbyteries we make up the EPC with about 145,000 members across the United States. Founded in 1981, we are a denomination united under the rule of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, and as head of this church, holding fast to the confessional standards laid out in the Westminster Confession of Faith (1640s England).

In our local congregation we elect leadership to help direct and implement the mission of Jesus Christ. A Nominating Committee, which is elected by the Congregation at large, is tasked with getting representatives to serve in our church offices. We elect Elders to serve on our Session. We elect Deacons to the Board of Deacons. Outside of our ecclesiastical function, we incorporate as a 501c(3) non-profit and elect Trustees to fulfill corporate law.

There are nine elders on the Session. Three classes (currently 2022, 2023, 2024) of three elders in each class, make it so the session receives three new members each year. These nine members carry the responsibility for all ministry and mission that takes place in this congregation. Two members of session may be called upon to represent your congregation within the work of the Presbytery.

Now, just imagine: Nine of your friends and colleagues, brothers and sisters in Christ, elected to build the Body of Christ in our local congregation as we join with 145,000 other believers. Do you think they need your help and support? Do you think they need your prayers? Do you think they need God's Holy Spirit to lift them when they are tired, and energize them with vision for their work? These are rhetorical questions of course.

In future articles we may need to talk about the workload and breakdown of committee structure for the Session. We may need to explore the work of the Deacons. We may examine other support groups in the life of FPC Hanford. All of this so that you might be better informed and appraised of how you can be and become the Church of Jesus Christ to this community and this world. My hope is that you will discover, who are we, so that you might define who we are becoming — with you and Christ in the center.

May your walk with Christ lead you to deep waters, to cast out your nets for an abundant catch.

NEWS Mission Moments

"Declare His Glory Among the Nations"

Psalm 96:3

God did remarkable things around the world through Samaritan Purse's Operation Christmas Child in 2021 and our First Presbyterian Church of Hanford is proud to be a part of what God is doing through this wonderful discipleship Program!

In 2021, Samaritan's Purse continued to declare God's glory through the Operation Christmas Child Program in more than 100 countries and territories including among many unreached people groups at the very ends of the earth. We praise God that more than 9.1 million shoebox gifts were distributed to children in need at over 81,000 outreach events!

Jeff & Dottie Crass, our local Operation Christmas Child Regional Representatives reported that shoeboxes from Kings and Tulare Counties were up this 2021 from 7,781 boxes in 2020 to 11,085 boxes in 2021 and "total" shoeboxes from our area were up 23%. Additionally, through the new "Build A Box" online program, Tulare-Kings (including Alaska) online orders were 5th highest and Fresno 4th highest in orders from our area. Our shoeboxes from the Tulare-Kings area were distributed to the Pacific Islands, Ecuador, and Lesotho, Africa.

Pacific Islands: To date, over 283,000 children on more than 960 inhabited Pacific islands have received shoebox gifts and have been given the opportunity to respond to the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Ecuador: "One Child At A Time"

The shoebox that 8-year-old Génesis was given in her native Ecuador was the first gift she had ever received. But as delighted as she was with her new doll and other fun toys, Génesis was even happier to learn how much God loved her and readily gave her life to Jesus. She then shared the Good News with her parents. "At my home, we talked about God, and Jesus saved my mom who was sick with COVID," she said. "I asked God for her healing and her salvation, and both of my parents were saved." Génesis, 8 years old.

The Impossible Made Possible — We praise God that in 2021 over 2.3 million children made decisions for Christ through the 12-lesson discipleship course <u>The Greatest Journey</u> teaching children how to follow Christ and share Him with others. Each shoebox is a Gospel opportunity that can be used by God to change a child's life for eternity—and change the course of many other lives as well.

As one Regional Team Leader said: "With Operation Christmas Child, God upsets social habits, overturns traditions and customs, and acquires a people for Himself. Through this ministry, the impossible becomes possible by virtue of God." Amen!











