In the last 100 years, advances in medicine have added two years to the average life expectancy every decade. But apparently, for many people, this is not enough. There are attempts to accelerate life expectancy especially among the rich and powerful. Here is what some of the world's wealthiest have pursued:

- Oracle co-founder Larry Ellison has spent \$430 million on anti-aging research and spent \$200 million on his cancer institute at the University of Southern California. He has often been quoted as saying "death never made any sense to me."
- In 2014 Google founders Sergey Brin and Larry Page announced a \$1.5 billion research center. They launched Calico, a life-extension company focusing on genetic research and the development of pharmaceuticals targeting diseases associated with old age.
- In 2016 Amazon founder Jeff Bezos and other investors gave \$116 million to Unity Biotechnology, whose aim is "targeting cellular mechanisms at the root of age-related diseases."
- Entrepreneur Dave Asprey, the creator of Bulletproof Coffee, takes about 150 supplements a day to delay cognitive decline. Asprey believes he will live to be 180. His various pioneering treatments on himself have cost him at least \$1 million so far.

The truth is that no amount of money or technology can cure death. It is inevitable. Scripture tells us that all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. And, the wages of sin is death. However, the gift of God is eternal life through faith in Jesus (Romans 3:23; 6:23). Jesus' death and resurrection assures us of this. Of course, this is the good news of Easter Sunday. God raised Jesus from the dead, conquering death in the process. The Apostle Paul tells us, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

Eternal life through faith in Jesus does not cost a single dollar. Have you made that faith commitment?

Living Water World Missions

A Thank You from Phil Mirise, Corresponding Secretary



Living Water World Missions is very appreciative of the support of First Presbyterian Church for this mission which they believe is helping to improve the lives of many people in Central America and the Caribbean through the production of clean drinking water and the presentation of the Gospel.

In January 2019, a team went to a village called San Pedro on the Shore of Lake Atitlan in West-Central Guatemala. The original system was installed there in 2009 and has been one of the most productive installations Living Water World Missions has had to date. It needed up-grading and repairs after so many years of use. Living Water World Missions does not hesitate to revisit former sites that are doing so much good and helping to improve the health and spiritual well-being of the people served by the local church. And in February a team just returned from installing another water filtration system in a small church in the Peten region of northern Guatemala. Living Water World Missions is convinced that by helping improve the health and quality of life for the people of Central America, fewer people will feel compelled to make the dangerous journey to America looking for a better life. Each system that is installed provides two or three jobs for system operators and delivery people working for the church where the system is located. It also creates some income for the local church, which can then be used to better spread the Gospel to their community. Living Water World Missions has installations scheduled for every month in 2019!

In addition, Living Water World Missions education program teaches mothers and children the importance of drinking only clean water, washing their hands and things for which they should and should not be using clean water. Part of the Biblically based curriculum focuses on germs – what they are, how they are spread and the illnesses they can potentially cause. There is plenty of water in Central America – sometimes too much – but it is all contaminated. There is no government infrastructure available to provide mechanisms to clean the water, keep it clean and then deliver it to the people. Even people in the big cities cannot safely drink the tap water.

"This is the mission to which God has called Living Water World Missions and your partnership with us in this mission is helping to alleviate that problem. We cannot thank you enough for your assistance in trying to make the world a better place!"

What are FPC Deacons?

Have you ever seen someone in need and thought: *I wish was there something I could do?* God may be softening your heart to become a Deacon or help them through donations. The Deacons are 12 elected church members who share the Gospel of Jesus Christ by providing *compassion* and *care* for our church family and community. Each Deacon serves for a term on three years. When funds are available, they distribute funds to local charities.

What do Deacons do?

- Monthly visit elderly shut-ins who cannot attend Sunday Worship.
- Prepare the Sacraments for monthly Communion, give cards, baby spoons, flowers or plants to church members in need.
- Prepare and serve food for Memorial Receptions.
- Distribute the food pantry and clothing received to local charities.
- Organize Santa for Seniors and Santa Angels.
- Fund and support these ongoing local programs: Salvation Army, Episcopal Church Soup Kitchen, KCAO Women's Shelter, Kings Gospel Mission, Laundry Love, and Military Mission.
- Newer programs also supported are Safe Families, Hands Reaching Out, Operation Share, and AWANA.
- Also one Deacon participates on the church's annual Nominating Committee.

How are Deacons funded?

Deacons receive direct funds from individual church members and the loose change offerings on the first Sunday of every even month. They are *not* funded by the General Budget of FPC.

As you can see, our Deacons are *very* active in spreading the Gospel through serving the needs of our church family and the community. We are *blessed* by these opportunities to serve.

2019 EPC Askings

The EPC Per-Member "Askings" for 2019 are the same as last year for a total of \$38 per member. The \$38.00 per member "Askings" provides \$23 towards the EPC General Assembly (GA) while \$15 goes to the EPC Pacific Presbytery region. The Per Member "Askings" are voluntary and the primary source of funding for both the GA & Pacific Region's budg-



ets. Our Session wants to support the EPC and has committed to funding our 102 members for a total amount of \$3.876.

Last year we calculated our "Askings" on 117 members which was a total amount of \$4,446. We had 53 members plus many generous donors who donated \$4,185 or 94.13% of the expense towards the "Askings", leaving \$261 paid from our operating expense to support EPC's GA and region. Our goal this year is to raise 100% of the "Askings" which will again help reduce our operating budget expenses for the year.

These "Askings" support: 1. The mission & service of the EPC to pursue God's vision to make a difference for Christ, the Gospel and the Kingdom of God in our communities, our country and the world; 2. The leadership which funds the committees, boards and special committees enabling them to pro-actively respond to the opportunities & challenges facing our growing denomination; 3. The ministry of the office of GA which serves, resources, connects and encourages EPC leaders, churches and presbyteries.

EPC is focusing this year on 4 strategic opportunities: 1) global movement, 2) transformation (church revitalization), 3) multiplication (church planting), and 4) effective biblical leadership. These exciting kingdom developments could not occur without your prayer and financial support.


