Greatest Qualities of a Life Dedicated to Christ?

What would you say are the greatest qualities of a life dedicated to Christ? Does faith, hope and love come to mind? 1 Cor. 13:13 lists these three attributes as supremely important.

Scripture describes faith as assurance of the unseen realm, which is infinitely more real than what is seen (Heb. 11:1). Indeed, without faith, it is impossible to be right with God (Heb. 11:6).

Hope and faith are flip sides of the same coin. Hope is confidence in what God has promised. The hope spoken of in the Bible is real, as opposed to wishful thinking which is all this world can offer.

Finally, there is love, which God extends to anyone willing to entrust their life to Christ. It is not conditional or transactional. It is pure, noble and deeply soul satisfying. We are to then be conduits of this love to a deeply broken and flawed world.

1 Cor. 13:13 tells us that love is the greatest of these three qualities. Why? It is because in eternity, when we come face to face with Jesus, our faith and hope will be fulfilled, though still a reality. Love endures as we experience the fullness of resurrection life.

So, dear Christian, be of good cheer! Faith, hope and love remain. But the greatest of these is love.

Finding "True Freedom" Through Jesus



Caleb and Sarah's marriage was at a braking point. "At one point I thought, 'I'm done. This can't go on like this. Something has to give," Sarah recalled.

Army Specialist Caleb Toppen endured multiple blasts while fighting in Afghanistan, and he witnessed horrific scenes that imprinted themselves in his memory. Then came the final blast from an improvised explosive device that caused a traumatic brain injury. He was awarded a Purple Heart and received an early honorable discharge for combat-related disability.

"I wasn't the same person," Caleb said. He suffered from post-traumatic stress – mental and emotional pain that he tried to numb in whatever way he could. For years, Sarah prayed for Caleb's healing, which she knew could only come through the Lord Jesus Christ.

Then Caleb heard the Gospel at the "Decision America Tarheel State Tour", held by Franklin Graham in cities throughout North Carolina. When he learned about the eternal life offered in Jesus, Caleb repented and trusted in Him as Savior.

But the specter of war still haunted him, and Caleb and Sarah continued to struggle in their relationship. When the couple arrived at "Samaritan Lodge Alaska" for a week with <u>Operation Heal Our</u> <u>Patriots</u>, their marriage was in crisis. But, during the week in Alaska, Caleb and Sarah experienced God's love for them in new ways. And as he learned about God's plan for him, Caleb realized he needed to let go of the shame and regret for the things he had experienced in combat.

So, on Thursday evening, he sat in his cabin and wrote those burdens down on a sheet of paper, praying as he thought about each horrific memory. Then, Caleb attached the list to a piece of wood, dropped it into the bonfire at the lodge, and watched with Sarah as it turned to ash. "When I threw that thing in the fire and watched it burn, those thoughts no longer had the same effect on me that they once had," he recalled.

The next morning, Caleb was baptized in the icy waters of Lake Clark. "The most eye-opening thing for me was that no matter what you've done, you're forgiven," he said.

Operation Heal Our Patriots, is a mission supported by First Presbyterian Church and it is a lifelong ministry to the veterans who have sacrificed their lives for our country. This ministry does not end when military couples return home from Samaritan's Lodge Alaska. It is only the **BEGINNING** of a life-long journey with God and of healing. As God continues to work in the lives of these veterans, Regional Chaplains walk beside them, staying in touch by phone and text, and making visits to minister in person to offer ongoing opportunities for marriage enrichment and followship with other military couples at reunions. 

The Community Enhancement Fund was originally set up by a donation for the enrichment of non-profit groups in our area. These nonprofits must include a member or regular attender of First Pres in their membership/board to be eligible. <u>Applications are offered online at www.fpchanford.org</u>. <u>Go to 'Events' tab, pull down to find</u> <u>App guidelines and application</u>. <u>Or, you may pick up an application</u> <u>at the church office. Call Annette (M-F – 8:00am to 1:00pm)</u>. Once a year, these applications are reviewed by the CE committee, the non-profits are interviewed, and a discussion and awarding of funds is granted from the funds approved by the Finance Committee.

These funds vary year by year, based on the performance of the fund from the stock market.

A stipulation made by the donor was that the funds be used for non-profits outside of the church, to the community non-profits that are supported by First Pres members or regular attenders. These funds may not be used for First Pres facilities or programs within our church.

If you know of a worthy non-profit organization that you as a member or regular attendee supports, please alert the head of that non-profit to this opportunity.

Prior Year recipients were:

- China Alley Preservation Society funds to help restore the Kings Hand Laundry
- Kings Gospel Mission funds to help purchase a mobile food cart to provide meals to those in need
- Kings Art Center funds to provide a new main circuit box and provide enhanced exhibit lighting
- Friends of the Kings Co Library funds to provide free books to children for the Winter Open House
- Kings Co Commission on Aging funds for State and Federal match for services to seniors-inneed
- God's Bread Box funds to help provide food boxes for needy families
- Foundation for Cal Retired Teachers Assn funds to help provide mini-grants for local teachers

CE funds have been distributed to non-profits since at least 1994, and with God's grace, will continue to be given to worthy groups in the future.
