2023 VBS Mission Project

The Great Commission in Matthew 28:19-20 tells us, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." This year our Vacation Bible School mission will be raising funds for StoryRunners, which is a ministry of Cru, that has a strong focus on the Great Commission.

Eighty percent or about 21.7 billion people in the world are oral learners. That means that they learn best through oral story telling. In addition to that 42% of the world's population live in unreached areas that have no access to the written Bible. StoryRunners ministers to these people.

StoryRunners has developed *The Promise*, which is a series of 42 Bible stories from Creation to the return of Christ that they share with people in their own language. *The Promise* offers opportunities for evangelism, discipleship and church planting.

StoryRunners offers three opportunities to serve. The first is the School of Storytelling where missionaries work with local people to develop *The Promise* in their own language. Once people groups have *The Promise* available to them in their language, the next step is to plant a church in their community. Story telling training equips teams to use the spoken Bible stories to minister to oral learners here in the US or overseas.

This year our FPC's Vacation Bible School team has set a goal to raise \$600 for StoryRunners throughout the week of June 26^{th} – June 29^{th} . If you would like to make a one-time tax-deductible donation to StoryRunners now, you may do so here:

The King's County Commission on Aging is proud to announce the Hanford Senior Center was officially re-opened on April 10 and will be offering hot meals every weekday, Monday through Friday at noon. The location of the meals is: View Road Apartments, 602 9 ¼ Ave, Hanford. They ask for you to call the day before at (559) 583-9258 to reserve your meal. They request a suggested donation of \$2.50 per meal for seniors and \$4.00 per meal for non-seniors; however no one will be turned away for inability to pay. At the grand re-opening party they had Bingo and Karaoke.

This is a great addition to our community's care for our senior citizens, providing opportunities for hot lunches, interaction and fellowship with others each week day.
