

#### Children's and Youth Director



The surgery was said to be "minimally invasive" with the plan for Mom to be in the hospital for a week and then go to Rehabilitation hospital for a week or two. As I write this, she is still in rehab but should come home in a week. It is hard to watch someone you love in pain...I wish I could make the pain go away or relieve it somehow. Last night in my devotional reading, <u>Bedside Blessings</u> by Charles Swindoll, this spoke to me:

The furnace of suffering provides not only light by which to examine our lives but heat to melt away the dross. Just as famine and financial ruin brought the prodigal son to his senses, so our trials bring us to our senses and draw us into the embrace of our Father. The common response to trials is resistance, if not outright resentment. How much better that we open the doors of our hearts and welcome the God-ordained trials as honored guests for the good they do in our lives. I Peter 1:6-7: You have been distressed by various trials, so that the proof of your faith... may be found to result in praise and glory.

Wow. This is such a good perspective on suffering and pain. It is my hope that this can be an encouragement to you when you are or someone dear to you is experiencing trials. Do you read some type of devotional daily? I highly recommend <u>Our Daily Bread</u>, which our church gives out for free. There's a scripture passage and helpful story with questions.

On Sunday nights, our youth are studying the book of James, presented by Francis Chan. If you have a child, grandchild, or friend in the age group of 6th through 12th grade, please encourage them to join us in this study. We meet on the 2nd and 4th Sunday evening of each month, from 5:00 to 8:30 pm. We usually meet at church but in the very hot summer months, we sometimes meet at peoples homes. #### Pastor's Report


- Homebound communion on May 8 & May 11




