Dear FPC Hanford Family -

This is a special issue of the newsletter because it covers July, the travel month, the hot month, and I wanted to do something more devotional for our church family. So let us address, "How to stay cool in the Hanford heat." We all know that the best way to stay cool is to not move and let the wind blow over you. My proposal then, is to spend our summer in stillness – in prayer – with the wind of God's Spirit blowing over us.



"Prayer with thanksgiving is one part of religious worship and is required by God from all believers." That is the way we state it in our confession. If we expect to live with God's grace and Holy Spirit active in our lives, we must continually nourish the relationship with God through prayer. We must pray to the one true God; the God revealed in God's living Word – Holy Scripture illuminated with God's Spirit. We need to humble ourselves and openly confess our inadequacies in the presence of God's majesty. We must pray knowing God hears our prayers for Christ's sake.

Our prayers are not preconditioned, nor are they prescribed phrases in a book. Our prayers need to come from the very deepest core of our being, reaching out to the very heart of God. Our prayers should be genuine concerns we bring to share before God. The summer is a good time to let our hearts melt before God with the deepest concerns we have in our life. Some of our prayers may be sung in joy or in anguish, in love and in hope, in fear and in celebration. All of our prayers must be passionate and with the deepest care for our lives, the lives of those we love, and the lives of those whom God loves.

One of the things you can't count on is the pastor covering all the prayer needs. The pastor is busy praying for their needs, their family's needs, and all those special needs brought to their attention, but they will not ever get the job done completely – they need your prayers. One of the great things about our reformed tradition is the emphasis that your access to God is just as great as any pastor's. When you pray, God enjoys your sincerity and genuineness, listens and responds just as if it were a pastor. Your pastoral love for one another is probably greater in God's sight than the one who sits behind the desk and writes about praying.

At FPC we need to be praying for our incoming pastor. Our Pastor Search Committee has been prayed for, and we should continue to pray for them. More than that, we should pray for that specific person who is to be called to FPC in the near future. As yet, unknown to us, but known to God. Pray for that specific person. Ask God to reveal to them and to us the blessing he has ready to bestow upon us.

If you need more models of prayer to feel more comfortable in style and direction, I suggest you examine the Gospel of John

in Chapter 17. Here Christ prays from his deepest inner being for concerns in his own life. Christ prays for those closest to him. Christ prays for you, that you might know the fullness of life in God's kingdom. Please join with Christ in prayer; for your own needs; for those closest to you; for those out in the world who need to come to Christ.

When my husband Tony was so sick in the hospital in the Fall of 2019, following his heart attack and stroke, we wondered if he would survive. Then we wondered if he would ever be able to eat again, walk again, drive again, live independently again. He said "If I ever get out of this hospital, I have a few things on my 'bucket list'" 1) I want to walk on the beach with you in Huntington Beach (his home town) 2) I want to go in person to a USC Football game (one of his favorite things to do in life) and 3) I want to go to Hawaii on vacation. Hawaii is a special place for us. We went there on our honeymoon, bought a timeshare (unexpectedly!) and have been back many times. This trip was so special: Tony was able to eat and walk and drive, as he has been doing for the last number of years. He was also able to snorkel and walk through the lava tube at Volcanoes National Park and swim in the ocean. We had a great time as a family and we are so very grateful to Christ for his faithfulness to us through all those months in the hospital the years of Tony's recovery. We feel truly blessed to be part of the Family of God: so many people prayed for us, helped us, brought us meals, gave us gifts, loved us. We strive to help and love others as an expression of our gratitude. Romans 8:38-39 has been a favorite verse of our family. I encourage you to look it up and memorize it with your family this Summer!

By the time you read this, Vacation Bible School will have just wrapped up! We are really excited about this special week and so very grateful for all the time, energy and love that has gone in to making it happen. A HUGE thank you goes to our VBS Director, Deborah Pelton for all of her skills, time, energy, and experience that she used to lead our church in this important time! Serve Day 2022! Expressing God's Love

Serve Day is a "community outreach mission" expressing God's love by being the hands and feet of Jesus to serve others! This year our church along with Koinonia Church, First Baptist Hanford, Glad Tidings, First United Methodist, New Hope Church and the United Way joined together in partnership to provide an event structured to "SERVE" the residents of Kings County and to show God's love to them. Volunteers throughout Kings County pre-signed up to give of their time and talents serving and performing needed community projects throughout Kings County for one of two mornings in May.

On Saturday May 14, 2022, our church hosted and provided the facilities and volunteers for oil changes and car washes for widows in our community. It was truly a full First Presbyterian Church outreach mission event lead by our Mission Ministry Team, Kevin and Stacey Jones, Director of Children & Youth Ministries, Sheri Winterowd, and our FPC Youth. Kevin Jones was the lead project leader for the oil changes and Sheri Winterowd oversaw our youth for the car washes. Volunteers from our church included: Kevin, Stacey, and Kalob Jones, Sheri and Brooke Winterowd, Paul Elansa, Nick and Michael Kinney, Bella and Tyler Uhlik, Cate Connelly, Brian, Deborah, Andrew and Megan Pelton, Emerson and Avery Mills, and Kelly Voyles. Helping with oil changes, Mike Gabel, Andy Gonzales and Travis Hartmann also assisted and were from other local churches. There were 11 oil changes completed for widows and numerous car washes performed leaving the cars "Sparkling Clean"!

Highlighting some of this year's "Community Serve Day" projects: 256 people volunteered, 29 projects total, 30 bikes fixed, 20 bikes given away, 40 gallons of paint used, \$3,000 given through the Joy Project, 2 breakfasts at KGM, \$300 worth of prizes given away, 45 senior care packages, 46 foster family's served, 30 bags given to child protective services to give to babies, kids, and teens that enter the system, 30 single parents served, 5 residential yards landscaped/cleaned, a new fence for a lady going through chemo and Kohl's Department Store providing volunteers to help with some of the community projects! Praise God for this awesome community outreach event!

"And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." Phil. 4:7




















Ffaith & Ellowship

There are several food options if you wish to eat at the park, as well as an ice cream vendor. Kingsburg's farmer's market is also located each Thursday at the park from 5-8:00.


