Summer is upon us, which means vacations and time away. In light of this, I would like to communicate to you a number of things through this month's article:

- I have begun a new sermon series which will take us through the summer. It is called *Living Well in Difficult Times* and is a study of the Book of Philippians. In this series, we will discover how to live lives characterized by integrity, character, grace and dignity; even in the midst of hardships. - Summer Bible Camp is July 15-19. Similar to previous Summer's Vacation Bible School, this will be a week of communicating to our school age children the love of Jesus through arts and crafts, music, games and Bible teaching. - We have made recent upgrades to the sound quality in our sanctuary/worship center. I have a new microphone and an additional speaker will be purchased. As designated by the Session/elder board, these funds come from existing, designated funds (apart from our operating budget).
- We are moving forward with making our campus a safe environment, particularly for our children. We now have a team of individuals who monitor our church campus each Sunday morning. The Buildings and Grounds Ministry team has installed safety coded door locks on the door leading into the choir room and the door leading into the childcare area. Plans have also been formalized to reconfigure the childcare check-in counter to make it safer. The Session has allocated existing designated funds for this project as well. Look for construction to begin soon.

Other ministry opportunities include Summer Body Life Dinners (June 19, 26, July 31, August 7), Laundry Love (Thursday July 18, 3 pm, at the Star Laundry) and the many small group opportunities that we have (please call the church office for more info 582-0283).

Finally, please be sure to keep your financial commitments to the ministry of FPC current while you travel this summer. FPC is involved in life-changing ministries, both local and abroad. Your support is needed. Thank you and have a great summer!

When Martha Rodriquez remembers why she chose to volunteer with Mercy Ships, there is a simple reason behind her decision: "If I didn't have this faith, or know how much God loved me, I wouldn't be here. The bottom line is: my faith...compels me to do this with joy."

As the Manager of the Hospital Out-Patient Extension (HOPE) Center, Martha works diligently with a team of Mercy Ships volunteers and local Guinean staff to facilitate after-surgery care for patients. Many patients require additional monitoring and treatment after their surgeries. The HOPE Center provides an off-ship space for physical and emotional healing. Here, patients and their caregivers, who often travel days or weeks to the ship, are offered safety, shelter, and a sense of community away from home. And as Manager of the HOPE Center, Martha has experienced countless transformations and stories of hope from the patients she sees every day.

Martha remembers an experience with a young mother of a baby who had a cleft lip. Her baby was dangerously malnourished from not being able to eat properly. The mother's eyes were vacant, and she had given up hope that her baby would survive. But as her baby recovered from surgery in the HOPE Center, Martha watched this once hopeless young woman experience the emotional healing she desperately needed. "All of the time she spent at the HOPE Center, and the love she received from all of us, showed her how we cared for the baby as our own, and I know that made a difference, Martha said. "She was always smiling at the end; I couldn't believe her transformation."

"I wake up every morning and I can't believe I get to do this job. I love this organization, and I love what we get to do. It's the relationships you build with these people and the changes you get to see in them – physical, spiritually, and emotionally," Martha said. "And it doesn't matter where I am or who I am with, it's about being a servant doing what Jesus asks us to do - to love each other, to give."

These stories of hope are an integral part of why Martha continues to use her skills to serve the people of Africa. And she acknowledges that it takes an entire team to help bring about the true healing that so many desperately need. While Martha's experience of being a long-term volunteer on the other side of the world might seem difficult, she has an entirely different perspective –


"People talk about making a sacrifice, but this is not a sacrifice for me.




