

#### Surviving The COVID-19 Pandemic!





poverty together with their frontline church partners and child sponsors, and even though COVID-19 has changed the lives of people Worldwide, Compassion's Mission has not changed!

Compassion staff have been taking every precaution to protect the children in the program. They have suspended all nonessential International travel to national offices and frontline church partners until travel restrictions have been lifted and it is safe to travel again. This means they are not permitting any International visitors to meet sponsored children, or to visit Compassion child development centers, or national offices.

They continue to teach hygiene to registered children (and moms in the Survival Program), which reduces the spread of illness. Staff are also educating families about social distancing and mask wearing, and in many communities, they are actively distributing masks and hand sanitizer to families. Compassion staff and volunteers are doing everything they can to minimize the impact to the children in the program.

Compassion families are provided with emergency food packs containing essentials like cooking oil, rice, flour, meats, vegetables and fruits. They have been prioritizing access to health checkups, hospital visits and medical treatments for Compassion children. And they are offering families rent assistance so they can stay in their homes.

There are now windows of some "normalcy" slowly beginning from when the pandemic first began; Compassion had to temporarily close child development centers and halt group activities in all of Compassion field countries. However, over the past few months some centers have been able to reopen, but some centers remain closed depending upon the country. In some areas where restrictions have been eased, students are meeting in small groups at the centers. In some communities, centers have been able to reopen fully. Regardless of status, staff are working with families to deliver emergency supplies during this time of crisis.

Please keep Compassion International in your daily prayers that it will continue to have the financial resources, staff, and volunteers necessary to continue its Mission administering to children in poverty and bringing them and their families to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior!





## A Note From: Children's and Youth Director

Hello First Pres Family,

It has been an exciting and busy month getting acquainted in this new role I have been called to. I have enjoyed getting to know the adults, youth, and children of First Pres and feel as though God could not have placed me in a more welcoming environment. I am excited about leading our Children and Youth Ministry forward as we begin to get back to our "new normal" way of life.

Looking forward, we are ready to make some adjustments in our Nursery and Powerhouse classes. Pastor Lou Paradise and I have been in communication about what would be best for our ministry.

These are the tentative ideas:

- Nursery: It is imperative that we have a nursery for our children ages 0-4. The Powerhouse curriculum is not age appropriate for our younger children. Additionally, we want to allow parents of young children the ease of attending worship. Being a mom of young children I know how valuable it is to have an hour of distraction free worship.
- Powerhouse K-2nd: This group of students will be more hands on while also being introduced to stories of the Bible.
- Powerhouse 3rd-5th: These students will be in a more structured learning environment with slightly more in depth teachings, while still engaging them with activities.
- Sunday School 6th-12th: This is a temporary group until we have the numbers to support breaking them up into more age appropriate groups. We have a volunteer (YAY!) that has offered to teach Sunday School to these groups starting September 12th from 9:00am-10:00am. During worship time (10:00-11:00) these students will be volunteering in the Nursery/Powerhouse or sitting with their parents if they are not scheduled.

Parents, grandparents, and lovers of our children of First Pres-Nursery volunteers, and Powerhouse volunteers are essential if we wish to grow and attract families to our congregation. As for Nursery volunteers, we will have the Youth rotate monthly under the supervision of an adult.

Positions In Need:

• Nursery Adult Supervisor: Be present and oversee: youth volunteers, safety and sanitation, check-in, check-out of children. Ideally you would be scheduled 1-2 months out of the year depending on the amount of volunteers available.

• Powerhouse Volunteer: Teach prepared Sunday School lessons to K-2nd or 3rd-5th students. Ideally you would be scheduled 1-2 months out of the year depending on the amount of volunteers available.

Please pray over our Children and Youth ministry as we make changes to accommodate our families and for the need of volunteers to be filled. If you are willing to volunteer in either of the positions available please speak to me after worship or you can call/email.






