Worship As Proclamation Of The Word

In May I began what should have been a series – alas I got waylaid. May was about **Preparing for Worship**. The waking of the Son on Sonday in our lives. Preparing ourselves fragrantly to come before the Lord. We are called together by God, offering hymns of praise and prayers or litanies of invocation or confession that we might be set right by God for the activity of worship. God's Holy Spirit comes and we are blessed in our worship. This next installment, though late, is the **Proclamation** of the Word.



The, "Book of Common Worship" says this: "Scriptures are read and their message is proclaimed." Well there it is again, the very thing that got me going on this series. To me, the **meaning** of the Word is what should be proclaimed. There are **lots of messages** in scripture, but **what it means** for our lives is what should be proclaimed in worship. Let me give you an example.

I once read a book by a person I consider very Christ centered and a committed theologian. At one point this author uses Matthew 19 for a discussion on divorce and how the church has re-interpreted its understanding in this area as theology; reshaped by our culture and our insights as the Christian faith progresses. There are all kinds of messages in this passage, but **Christ is careful to give us the** center-point of **meaning**. Christ quotes God's intent for marriage from Genesis 2:24 – this is the meaning he wants to make clear. Unfortunately, the author (someone I consider a great gift to the church and a friend) never points out the meaning, only how mankind has confused the messages over the years.

Paul Stookey (from Peter, Paul and Mary) has a line like this: "If you get the message, you may refuse it. Oh, but if you get the meaning, you never lose it" – from "The Winner"

**How can you help proclaim the Word of God?** Read the scriptures for the day as you prepare to worship. Find out what you believe to be the meaning – what should we do because of God's Word? Share your insights with others. Share your insights with the pastor or elders. Be ready to proclaim before God the Good News of the Word.

The section on proclamation will include a thorough and clear reading of the Word – Volunteer to be a reader. This section includes singing hymns or anthems or spirituals between the text readings – Join the choir, volunteer a solo, instrumental or vocal, that will help us focus on the meaning of God's Word. You can be a very active worshipper during the Proclamation of the Word time of worship.

Many people believe proclamation of the Word is the high-point of the service. It is the time when the pastor, "stirs our souls." In the October newsletter I want to propose that **responding** in worship keeps leading to **the highest point in worship** – **the Sacraments and the Sending**.

I had the opportunity recently to take a tour of their facility and was very impressed with the organization. The center is available to anyone, (with or without health insurance) free of charge and is confidential. This is a list of the services they provide:

- \* Free Pregnancy Testing \*Caring Peer Counsel
- \* Accurate Information on all Options
- \* Education on Fetal Development
- \* Sexual Purity and Lifestyle Counsel
- \* Earn While You Learn Parenting Classes/Mentoring
- \* Mom Store with Material Goods (clothing, diapers, strollers etc.)
- \* Post Abortion Help and Bible Study Support Group
- \* Referrals to Parent Life for ongoing support for teen parents
- \* Referrals for medical care, adoption counsel & maternity care homes
- \* Referrals to pastors, local churches, and Biblically based counseling

How can you continue to help this ministry? Keep them in mind if you have any new or gently used baby items, clothing (newborn to 4T), diapers, furniture, and unopened infant formula or baby food. Unfortunately, they cannot accept used car seats at this time due to state regulations. And, of course, they always appreciate a monetary donation.


In September, the kids are back to school and we wish them Christ's richest blessings as they learn and grow in another school year. Several are at new schools and all of the students could really use your prayers!




# Ffaith & Ellowship


