

A Personal Moment for Missions By Sue Kinney

When I was a little girl, my Mother used to tell me about her brother who lived in Jamestown New York and ran the Union Gospel Mission there. She would tell me about the things my Uncle John and his wife did running the Mission along with their 3 children; it was a career for them and they had very little but gave much to the unfortunate. Our family never had the opportunity to visit them in New York but as I got older, I corresponded with my Uncle John and Aunt Ginny. My Uncle was a talented musician and vocalist as well and on occasion, Aunt Ginny would send me copies of his music that he had written for the Mission.

My Uncle John was a hard and dedicated worker who enlisted in the U.S. Army on July 31, 1944, on his 18th birthday. He served in both World War II and the Korean War. He was a 1960 graduate of the University of Northwestern Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota and pastored the Beloit Road Baptist Church from 1960-65. He was the director of the Milwaukee, Wisconsin Rescue Mission from 1965-69, and worked for the Billy Graham Ministries from 1969-72. He served as the Executive Director of the Union Gospel Mission in Jamestown, New York, along with his wife from 1972 until his retirement in 2015 – retiring due to health reasons. He was a true man of God - very passionate about serving the "least of these."

After my Uncle John left the Mission, the mission was dissolved and the building, about 160 years old, sat empty. In 2017, the United Christian Advocacy Network, UCAN, purchased the building, renovated it, and re-opened in April of that year to carry on the work, begun more than four decades ago as the Union Gospel Mission by the late and much loved Rev. John Steinhauser. In honor of my Uncle John, they have named the Chapel there after him.

The United Christian Advocacy Network, UCAN, like, our Kings Gospel Mission here in Hanford, offers safe and secure temporary housing for the homeless, veterans, and a recently newly opened shelter for women and children. They are also expanding to a second location to help serve more people. They exist to help all those who need to break the cycle of life-controlling problems by promoting positive lifestyle changes through multidisciplinary programs and partnerships focused on and driven by a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

My Uncle John is the one who inspired me to work with our Missions Ministry Team at First Presbyterian Church! Mission work can be local or worldwide – either way, it is an opportunity to serve our Lord through sharing the Gospel!

A Note From: Children's and Youth Director

Happy November! Wow, can you believe that we are already in the last few months of 2021?! What a blessing this season brings. My prayers for our children and youth as we enter the winter months are of health and healing. So many young ones have to miss out on weeks of school due to colds/illnesses and while it is very important to the safety of their community, it still negatively impacts them on a variety of levels.

As a momma and former teacher, good hygiene skills are imperative to staying healthy. Just a few tips that I use with my kiddos and also learned from the classroom:

Make washing hands a habit! This should be done multiple times a day. Set a timer by the sink, get some fun soap, or let them pick out their own. We even have a little nail scrub brush at the sink to get around and under the nails.

Remind your littles to give their friends some space. Talk to them about staying in their own bubble. Then explain why we're doing this- let them know that germs are more likely to be passed around if were really close to our friends. There are some YouTube videos that show germs flying around if you want a visual for them.

Talk to your kiddos about not sharing food. You would think this is a no-brainer, but I had to remind my students all the time to not share their food at recess. We know that is not hygienic, but kids don't necessarily.
