What are FPC Deacons

Have you ever seen someone in need and thought: I wish there was something I could do? God may be softening your heart to become a Deacon or help them through donations. The Deacons are 9 elected church members who share the Gospel of Jesus Christ by providing compassion and care for our church family and community. Each Deacon serves for a term of three years. When funds are available, they distribute funds to local Christian charities.

What do Deacons do?

- Monthly visit elderly shut-ins who cannot attend Sunday Worship.
- Prepare the Sacraments for monthly Communion, give cards, baby spoons, flowers or plants to church members in need.
- Prepare and serve food for Memorial Receptions.
- Distribute the food and clothing received to local charities.
- Organize Santa for Seniors and Santa Angels.
- Fund and support these ongoing local programs: Salvation Army, Episcopal Church Soup Kitchen, KCAO Women's Shelter, Kings Gospel Mission, Laundry Love, Military Mission, Safe Families, Hands Reaching Out, AWANA, and others.
- Also, one Deacon participates on all the church's nominating committees.

Clothing and food donations are always appreciated. Specific suggestions include:

- * Dried pasta
- *Bulk rice & beans
- * Canned sauces
- * Tortillas
- * Chips & cookies
- *Canned vegetables & fruit
- * Individual servings of: Cereal, cookies, ramen (cup), fruit cups, soups, toiletries, aspirin, Tylenol, band aids.

As you can see, our Deacons are very active in spreading the Gospel through serving the needs of our community. We are blessed by these opportunities to serve.

Samaritan's Purse Who Is Your Neighbor?


Samaritan's Purse recently sent their ministry team to ask a question to national church leaders in the Democratic Republic of the Congo: "Who is my neighbor?" The team defined their "real neighbor as someone who is in need spiritually and/or physically. Participants decided that inmates in a nearby prison were their real neighbors.

They visited the inmates, bringing food, water, Bibles, and songbooks. They prayed with the prisoners, shared the Word of God with them, and encouraged them. As a result of the love shown to them, 31 prisoners received Jesus Christ as their Savior.

"Since we started reading the Bible, we noticed a big change in our lives," said a 23-year-old inmate. "Upon my release, I was preparing to seek revenge against the person who accused me and caused me to go to prison. After you taught us about forgiveness, I forgave that person and I am encouraging my prison mates to forgive those who have offended them."

The Congolese church leaders and members of their congregations continue to visit the prisons, ministering to those who need to know the power of Christ's redeeming love. Samaritan's Purse thanks our congregation for the gifts that enable them to support the work of local pastors around the globe through evangelistic training and the distribution of Christian reading and audiovisual materials.




















At the present time there is no activity planned for November. As many as can physically do so, join us on November 6 to pack a box for Operation Christmas Child.
