# "Refueling Center" Pastor Tim Brown

Relationships are critical to our spiritual health and vitality. Often, when we struggle in our relationships, we end up struggling spiritually. Conversely, when our relationships are thriving, it is easier to thrive spiritually. Everyone I know wants better relationships. I have yet to meet anyone who has a deep desire for unhealthy relationships. However, I have met A LOT of people who falsely assume that healthy relationships just happen. Thriving, healthy relationships require work and effort. They do not happen by accident.

"Healthy Relationships are a refueling center for life." I get a warning light and an audible alarm on my truck when I am low on fuel. I know that I have only a few miles until I have to refuel, or I will run out of gas. It would be foolish of me to ignore the warning light and alarm. I won't share how many times I have ignored the warning! Let's just say that I have many spare gas cans in my garage.

The same can happen in relationships. All relationships get depleted at times; however, healthy relationships are a refueling center for life. In a healthy relationship, individuals

understand the importance of filling each other's love tank. When we don't understand this vital function of relationships...to refuel each other.... all areas of our lives can be impacted. We all need regular deposits of love in life.

The Bible says that for relationships to function well, the warmth and the love of God need to fill each of us so full that we splash and spill His love over all our relationships. One of the paradoxes of relationships that Jesus taught was that when we refuel others, we get refueled ourselves. "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you" (Luke 6:38, NIV).

So how can we be a refueling center for our relationships? Here are three things to do.

#### 1. Say warm words.

Read and apply these Proverbs: "An anxious heart weighs a man down, but a kind word cheers him up" (Proverbs 12:25, NIV). Pleasant words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones" (Proverbs 16:24, NIV). Are the words you use more like vinegar or honey? When was the last time you sincerely expressed appreciation for someone?



#### 2. Do kind deeds.

John challenges us, "Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth," (1 John 3:18, NIV).

Look for ways to help and serve others. As I write this, I think of a "magic drawer" that I opened this morning. I had been out of my favorite toothpaste for a week or so and I kept forgetting to purchase more. This morning, when I opened my bathroom vanity drawer, a surprise awaited me. My favorite toothpaste had "magically" appeared. Of course, the one responsible for that magical deed was my wife, Jen. Her kind act filled my love tank and made my morning.

#### 3. Give thoughtful gifts.

Remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive' (Acts 20:35, ESV). Thoughtful gifts do not have to be expensive. In fact, one of the most valuable gifts you can give to someone is the gift of time. Making the effort to share your love and appreciation for someone can fill their love tank. But here's the deal. If we want our relationship tanks filled, we must give with the right attitude and give with no strings attached. If we give with an expectation of getting something in return, then we have given with selfish motives, and that is not love.

February is often set aside as a month to celebrate relationships and love. Step up and challenge yourself to be a refueling center in your relationships.




