After many weeks of rehearsals and costume-making, the church's second-grade Sunday school class finally came to the big night of putting on the annual Christmas pageant. Excitement was in the air as every child had a special part to play. Mary and Joseph, the shepherds, the angels, and many farm animals were there. But, to create the desired dramatic effect, it had been

decided that the role of the Christ child would be played not by a person but by an electric light bulb hidden in the manger.

The idea was that, at the right time, all the stage lights would be turned off so that only the brightness of the light in the manger could be seen. At least, that was the intent. But, when the lights went out, the boy who controlled the light panel got confused, and he turned out all the lights -- including the light bulb in the manger. It was a tense few moments until one of the shepherds said in a loud stage whisper to the boy who controlled the lights, "Hey! Billy, you switched off Jesus! Turn him on again, will ya, so we can have Christmas?"

Children can be very insightful, can't they? What could be a more urgent request that we all need to hear at this time of year than the one spoken by that little boy: "Turn Jesus on again, will ya, so we can have Christmas." Often, we miss the true glory of Christmas because Christ gets turned off in our lives by all that goes on, and we get distracted and miss the glory and anticipation of Christmas. May this year be different.

Advent means the anticipated arrival of royalty or someone important. For Christians, Advent is the four Sundays leading up to Christmas day. It is a time of preparation and celebration. It is a season of giving and receiving. It is a season of renewal and hope. The following prayer is one that I like to recite during the season of Advent. You can make it your prayer as well.

#### A Season of Thanksgiving and Celebration

The FPC Session and I want to thank you for your commitment to the Kingdom of God and our church. Your generosity is being demonstrated in various ways. 
